COACHING STAFF MEMBERS

DUANE M. KLUEH----Head Basketball Coach (Indiana State '49)

One of Indiana State's all-time great basketball players, Duane Klueh returns to his Alma Mater this season, just six years after graduation, to take over the head coaching position from his coach, John L. Longfellow. Longfellow who directed court play at Indiana State for six years (1948-49 to 1953-54) was forced by illness to quit coaching duties shortly after the start of his seventh season last year (1954-55).

Klueh comes back to Indiana State after four successful coaching years at Fowler, Indiana, high school and two years of professional basketball play. Following his college days at Indiana State, 1946-49, Klueh joined the pro ranks as a member of the Denver Nuggets. Midway in the season (1949-50), he became a member of the Fort Wayne Zollner Pistons' pro quintet where he stayed for the remainder of the 1949-50 season and all of the 1950-51 season.

At Fowler, his teams won 66 games and lost 30. His 1951-52 team had a 10-13 record, the 1952-53 unit won 15 and lost 9, the 1953-54 squad won 20 of 24, and his 1954-55 quintet had a 21-4 mark.

As an Indiana State basketball player, Klueh set three scoring marks which still stand: Season scoring total of 597 points (1947-48); 17.6-point game average (34 games) in 1947-48; and three-total of 1432 points. He was a first-string forward for three years, 1946-47, 1947-48, and 1948-49.

In 1948, he was one of ten players in the nation picked on the Helms All-American team. That same year, 1948, he was a standout in the Kansas City, Mo., N.A.I.A. tourney and was named on the first All-Tourney team and picked for the tourney's Most Valuable Player award.

He earned both his B.S. (1949) and M.S. (1951) degrees at Indiana State. He is married to the former Miss Mary Alice Shannon of Terre Haute and they have three children, Larry Joseph 6; Katherine Ann 3; and Mary Martha 1. A World War II veteran, he was in the U.S. Navy and served aboard the U.S.S. Wasp.

He was Little State tennis champion (Indiana) in 1948, and will serve also as the college's tennis coach. He was end coach of the 1955 Sycamore football team.

ROBERT L. HOLLAR-----Assistant Varsity Basketball Coach (Manchester '41)

Newly-appointed frosh coach this season. Robert L. Hollar will assist Head Coach Klueh with the varsity squad. He served as line coach of the Indiana State football team this past season (1955) and in 1951 and 1952.

A member of the Indiana State faculty since 1950, Hollar was Dean of the Indiana State Teachers College Laboratory School prior to his appointment as college frosh coach. He assisted in coaching all sports in the Laboratory School.

A Manchester College graduate, he served as a coach in several Indiana high schools before coming to the college campus in 1950. He was coach at Van Buren, Indiana, 1941-42; Hanover College, instructor and coach, 1947; and New Paris, Indiana, coach, 1948-50.

EDWARD G. ZEMBAL----Junior Varsity Basketball Coach (Purdue '55)

A recent graduate of Purdue University, Edward G. Zembal will coach the Junior Varsity squad for the 1955-56 season. He served as backfield coach of Indiana State's 1955 football team.

A native of Chicago, Ill., Zembal attended Weber High School, Chicago, and was chosen for two consecutive years, 1949 and 1950, on the All-Chicago area football and basketball teams. He won four major football letters as a halfback on Purdue elevens of 1951-52-53-54. He played in the 1955 Blue-Gray Charity Bowl football game in Montgomery, Ala.

PRE-SEASON OUTLOOK

Indiana State's new Head Basketball Coach Duane Klueh faces a twenty-one game 1955-56 season with a very young and inexperienced band of ballplayers. Klueh takes over a squad that has only two returning lettermen from last year's team. Bob Cripe, 6-6, sophomore center from Elkhart, and Bill Sisk, 6-2½, junior, forward from Attica, were the only lettermen holdovers from last year's team to greet Klueh at the first practice session.

Three returning lettermen just back from duty with Uncle Sam have brightened the Sycamore basketball hopes considerably. Back in the fold are: Sam Richardson, 6-3, junior center from South Bend who was elected to the all-conference first team as a freshman in the 1951-52 season and made the all-conference again the next year as a sophomore; Bob Gilbert, 6-6, junior center-forward from Terre Haute; and Jerry Ferguson, 6-2, junior forward, also of Terre Haute.

Other returning 1954-55 squad members, Jim Bates, 6-2, sophomore forward from Martinsville, and Gene Williams, 6-3, guard from Logansport, are on hand to join a crop of promising freshmen who combined with the lettermen, make up the material with which Coach Klueh has to work during the season.

Freshmen include: Ted Dayhuff, 5-11, forward from Riley; Ezra Smithson, 6-2, forward from Paris, Ill.; Cliff Phillips, 5-10, and Don Blair, 5-8, guards from Terre Haute; and Bob Clark, 5-11, guard from Lafayette. Wayne Salmon, 5-10, junior guard from Evansville, and John Luse, 6-2, sophomore forward from Jamestown, are also new to the team this year.

Dick Murray, 6-3 freshman from Elkhart, and Jim Waugh, 6-3 freshman from Terre Haute, both varsity football players, may develop into valuable assets to the team before the season is wrapped up. Transfer student Dick Kirkpatrick, a 6-3 freshman forward from Terre Haute, must wait until January 1 before he is eligible to make his contribution to the Sycamore cause.

The Sycamores have the tallest squad that they have had in many years, but with a team composed of five juniors, five sophomores, and eight freshmen they probably have their greenest team in years.

With the added height, Indiana State should be fairly strong on the boards but whether that will be able to make up for lack of overall experience, particularly at the guard positions, remains to be seen.

Coach Klueh's young squad is hard at work seeking to improve last year's 3-9, last place conference finish and the overall, 9-15, 1954-55 record.
